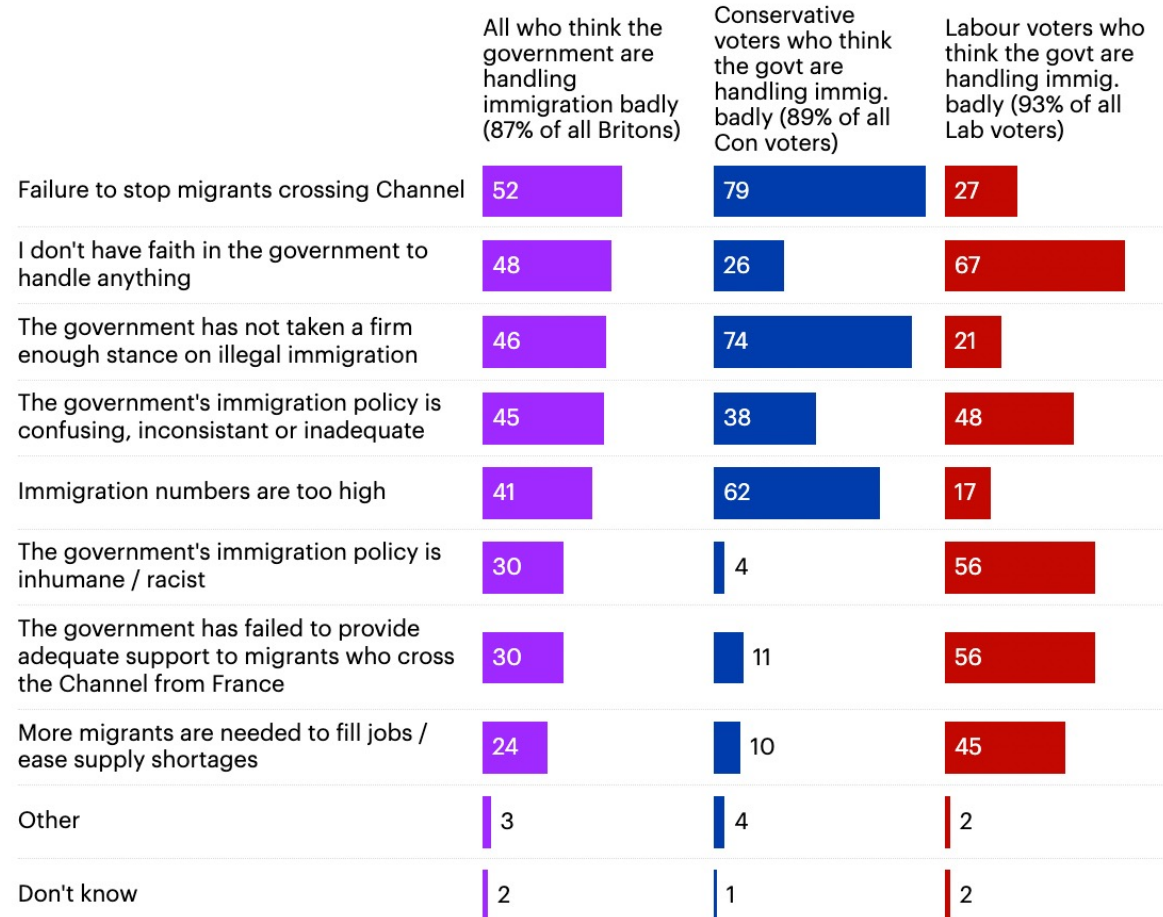

WHY CLASSICS?

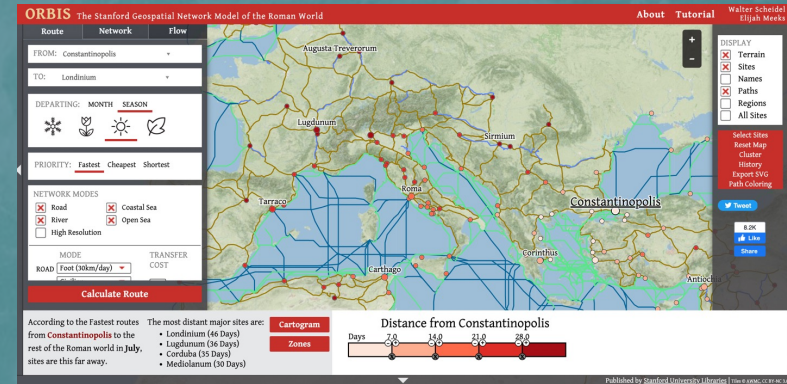
Provides a deep history of migration

*We are **NOT** trying to preach or moralise*

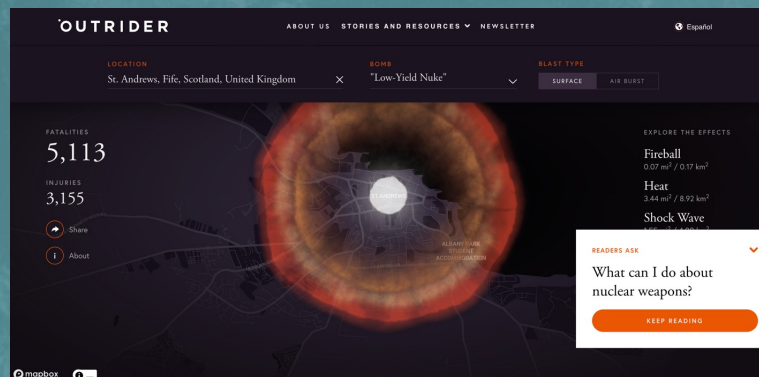

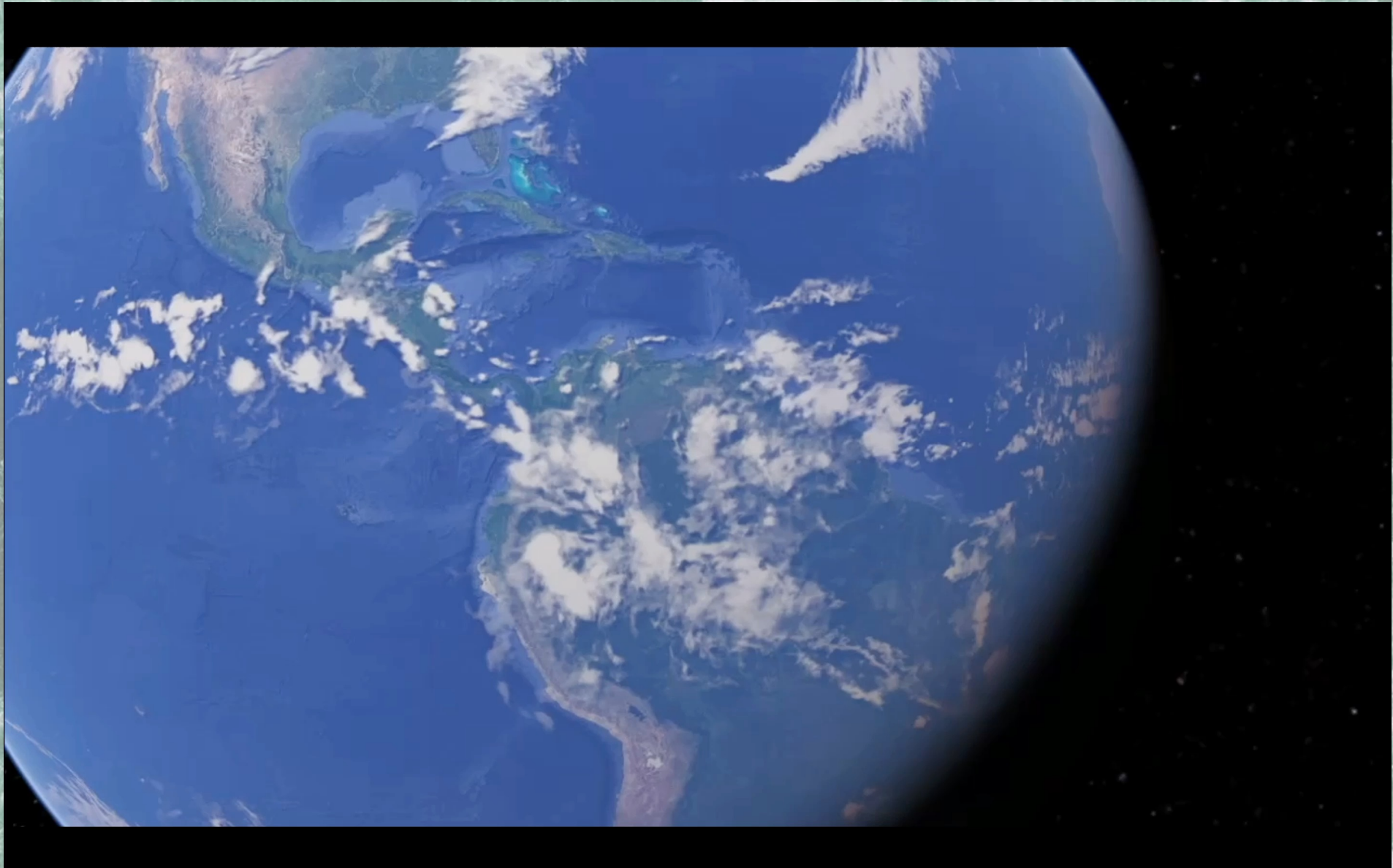
